| Alcoholic liquors or beverages moving intrastate, or originating from or destined to KY. | Hazardous and Non-Hazardous Waste. |
| Articles which because of their bulk, length, width, or height cannot be safely stowed within a trailer or container. | Hides, green or wet. |
| Articles requiring protection from heat or cold. | HVAC oversized units defined as a single unit 60" or greater in length |
| Articles liable to impregnate or otherwise damage equipment or other freight. | Jewelry, other than costume or novelty jewelry (See NOTE 2). |
| Articles of extraordinary value. | Letters, with or without stamps affixed. |
| Automobiles. | Mail when the consignor and consignee are U.S. Post Offices. |
| Bank Bills. | Money or notes. |
| Bullion. | Mounted or stuffed animals to or from Canada. |
| Cannabis, CBD, Hemp, Marijuana and products containing these ingredients. | Museum exhibits or articles of antiquity (See NOTE 3). |
| Carbon Black, Graphite Powder contained in insufficient packaging. | Original works of art, statues or paintings (See NOTE 4). |
| Cigarettes, cigars, smokeless tobacco, electronic nicotine delivery, or any commodity containing tobacco or imitation tobacco or those mixed with these ingredients when delivering to the end consumer. | Pesticides recalled by the manufacturer or pesticides that have been suspended and canceled (refer to 40 CFR 273.3). |
| Clams, crabs, lobsters, oysters, and shrimp. | Pianos. |
| Currency, other than coin. (See NOTE 1). | Platinum, gold, silver, and other precious metals. |
| Deeds. | Polychlorinated biphenyls, liquid UN 2315, solid UN3432 |
| Drafts. | Precious stones, cut or uncut. Quicksilver (Metallic Mercury). |
| Firearms. | Radioactive Waste. |
| Fish, except smoked or canned. | Revenue stamps. |
| Flora and fauna (live plants). | Securities, stamps, stock certificates, or letters. |
| Furs. | Shipments that contain in whole or in part, articles prohibited by law. |
| Hazardous Material viz: | Spent Lead Batteries, i.e. batteries that contain or contained acid. |
| -Aluminum Phosphide, Chemical Hazard Risk Assessment 18 or greater | Used fluorescent bulbs moving to a recycler. |
| -Dangerous when wet (Class 4.3) | Used or obsolete mercury containing equipment. |
| -Infectious substances (Class 6.2) | Valuable papers including documents containing Personal Identifiable Information (PII). |
